

# Classical Studies Major Planning Guide: Greek Emphasis

The major consists of a choice of twelve upper-division courses (forty-eight units) approved for the program and listed under "Courses" on the Classical Studies website and in the general catalog. All courses used to meet requirements for a major in Classical Studies must be taken for a letter grade and be passed with a grade of C- or better.

*Prerequisites-We recommend students take the language courses first or in tandem with LTWL 19:*
